## INTRODUCTION

The Model AV-112C-PS-NSTB linear amplifier accepts input voltages in the range of 0 to $\pm 2 \mathrm{~V}$ and amplifies them with a fixed gain of +30 . The maximum output voltage is $\pm 60 \mathrm{~V}$. The -3 dB power bandwidth is $>100 \mathrm{kHz}$.

The maximum peak output current is $\pm 1.5 \mathrm{~A}$ nominally. The output current is actively limited to 1.6A, approximately.

The maximum average output current is $\pm 0.3 \mathrm{~A}$ nominally. The internal high-voltage DC power supplies will be disabled for several seconds if the average output current exceeds 0.5 A , approximately. The average current sensing circuit incorporates a low pass filter with an RC time constant of 8 seconds, approximately.

The amplifier circuitry uses $\pm 84 \mathrm{~V}$ power supply rails internally. The power dissipation in the amplifier circuitry is given by $\mathrm{P}_{\text {DISS }}=\left|\left(\mathrm{V}_{\text {RAIL }}-\mathrm{V}_{\text {OUT }}\right) \times \mathrm{l}_{\text {OUT }}\right|$, where $\mathrm{V}_{\text {RAIL }}$ is +84 V for positive $\mathrm{V}_{\text {out }}$ and -84 V for negative $\mathrm{V}_{\text {out. }}$. ## INSTALLATION

## VISUAL CHECK

After unpacking the instrument, examine to ensure that it has not been damaged in shipment. Visually inspect all connectors, knobs, and handles. Confirm that a power cord is with the instrument. If the instrument has been damaged, file a claim immediately with the company that transported the instrument.

## POWER RATINGS

This instrument is intended to operate from $100-240 \mathrm{~V}, 50-60 \mathrm{~Hz}$.
The maximum power consumption is 90 Watts. Please see the "FUSES" section for information about the appropriate AC and DC fuses.

This instrument is an "Installation Category II" instrument, intended for operation from a normal single-phase supply.

## CONNECTION TO THE POWER SUPPLY

An IEC-320 three-pronged recessed male socket is provided on the back panel for AC power connection to the instrument. One end of the detachable power cord that is supplied with the instrument plugs into this socket. The other end of the detachable power cord plugs into the local mains supply. Use only the cable supplied with the instrument. The mains supply must be earthed, and the cord used to connect the instrument to the mains supply must provide an earth connection. (The supplied cord does this.)

## PROTECTION FROM ELECTRIC SHOCK

Operators of this instrument must be protected from electric shock at all times. The owner must ensure that operators are prevented access and/or are insulated from every connection point. In some cases, connections must be exposed to potential human contact. Operators must be trained to protect themselves from the risk of electric shock. This instrument is intended for use by qualified personnel who recognize shock hazards and are familiar with safety precautions required to avoid possibly injury. In particular, operators should:

1. Keep exposed high-voltage wiring to an absolute minimum.
2. Wherever possible, use shielded connectors and cabling.
3. Connect and disconnect loads and cables only when the instrument is turned off.
4. Keep in mind that all cables, connectors, oscilloscope probes, and loads must have an appropriate voltage rating.
5. Do not attempt any repairs on the instrument, beyond the fuse replacement procedures described in this manual. Contact Avtech technical support (see page 2 for contact information) if the instrument requires servicing. Service is to be performed solely by qualified service personnel.

## ENVIRONMENTAL CONDITIONS

This instrument is intended for use under the following conditions:

1. indoor use;
2. altitude up to 2000 m ;
3. temperature $5^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ to $40^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$;
4. maximum relative humidity $80 \%$ for temperatures up to $31^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ decreasing linearly to $50 \%$ relative humidity at $40^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$;
5. Mains supply voltage fluctuations up to $\pm 10 \%$ of the nominal voltage;
6. no pollution or only dry, non-conductive pollution.

## FUSES

This instrument contains four fuses. All are accessible from the rear-panel. Two protect the AC prime power input, and two protect the internal DC power supplies. The locations of the fuses on the rear panel are shown in the figure below:


## AC FUSE REPLACEMENT

To physically access the AC fuses, the power cord must be detached from the rear panel of the instrument. The fuse drawer may then be extracted using a small flat-head screwdriver, as shown below:


## DC FUSE REPLACEMENT

The DC fuses may be replaced by inserting the tip of a flat-head screwdriver into the fuse holder slot, and rotating the slot counter-clockwise. The fuse and its carrier will then pop out.

## FRONT PANEL CONTROLS



1. POWER Switch. This is the main power switch. When turning the instrument on, there may be a delay of several seconds before the instrument appears to respond.
2. OVERLOAD Indicator. When the instrument is powered, this indicator is normally green, indicating normal operation. If this indicator is yellow, an internal automatic overload protection circuit has been tripped. If the unit is overloaded (by operating at an exceedingly high duty cycle or by operating into a very low impedance), the protective circuit will disable the output of the instrument and turn the indicator light yellow. The light will stay yellow (i.e. output disabled) for about 5 seconds after which the instrument will attempt to re-enable the output (i.e. light green) for about 1 second. If the overload condition persists, the output will be disabled again (i.e. light yellow) for another 5 seconds. If the overload condition has been removed, the instrument will resume normal operation.

This overload indicator is only likely to come on in two situations:

- Briefly at startup. This is not a cause for concern.
- When the load impedance is too low (<1.2 k $\Omega$ ). In this case, turn off the instrument and connect the proper load.

3. IN Connector. The input signal is applied to this connector. The input impedance is approximately $1 \mathrm{k} \Omega$. The input range is nominally 0 to $\pm 2 \mathrm{~V}$ for normal operation. The input stage will safely withstand inputs of up to $\pm 15 \mathrm{~V}$.
4. OUT Connector. This BNC connector provides the main output signal. The output is an amplified version of the input on (3). The gain ( $\mathrm{Vout}_{\mathrm{ou}} / \mathrm{V}_{\mathrm{I}}$ ) is fixed at +30 V .

## REAR PANEL CONTROLS



1. AC POWER INPUT. An IEC-320 C14 three-pronged recessed male socket is provided on the back panel for AC power connection to the instrument. One end of the detachable power cord that is supplied with the instrument plugs into this socket.
2. AC FUSE DRAWER. The two fuses that protect the AC input are located in this drawer. Please see the "FUSES" section of this manual for more information.
3. DC FUSES. These two fuses protect the internal DC power supplies. Please see the "FUSES" sections of this manual for more information.

## GENERAL INFORMATION

## BASIC CONTROL

The AV-112C-PS-NSTB is a DC to $>100 \mathrm{kHz}$ fixed-gain linear amplifier. The gain is +30 .

The required voltage input signal is applied at the "IN" connector.
This mode is illustrated below:


## OUTPUT LIMITS

The maximum peak output current is $\pm 1.5 \mathrm{~A}$ nominally. The output current is actively limited to 1.6 A , approximately.

The maximum average output current is $\pm 0.3 \mathrm{~A}$ nominally. The internal high-voltage DC power supplies will be disabled for several seconds if the average output current exceeds 0.5 A , approximately. The average current sensing circuit incorporates a low pass filter with an RC time constant of 8 seconds, approximately.

The amplifier circuitry uses $\pm 84 \mathrm{~V}$ power supply rails internally. The power dissipation in the amplifier circuitry is given by $P_{\text {DISS }}=\left|\left(V_{\text {RAIL }}-V_{\text {OUT }}\right) \times l_{\text {OUT }}\right|$, where $V_{\text {RAIL }}$ is +84 V for positive $\mathrm{V}_{\text {out }}$ and -84 V for negative $\mathrm{V}_{\text {out. }}$. The average $\mathrm{P}_{\text {DIss }}$ must not exceed 40 W over any 200 ms interval. The average power sensing circuit incorporates a low pass filter with an RC time constant of 100 milliseconds, approximately. If this limit is exceeded, the output will be disabled for a short period (governed by the RC time constant).

The load impedance may be any combination of resistance and/or capacitance that respects the above limits.

## CABLE LENGTHS

The length of cable used to connect the load to the output of the function generator should be less than 3 feet ( 1 meter), and ideally less than 18 inches ( 0.5 meters). At longer lengths, the transmission line reflections caused by the cabling will distort the output signal, particularly if the signals with fast rise times are used.

## OPERATIONAL CHECK

This section describes a sequence to confirm the basic operation of the instrument. It should be performed after receiving the instrument. It is a useful learning exercise as well.


Basic Test Arrangement

1) Connect a $200 \Omega$, 10W non-inductive test load between the OUT connector and ground. If cabling is used, keep it less than 3 feet / 1 meter in length.
2) Set the signal generator to produce $a \pm 2 \mathrm{~V}, 25 \mathrm{kHz}$ waveform. (The input impedance of the $\mathrm{AV}-112 \mathrm{C}-\mathrm{PS}-\mathrm{NSTB}$ is $1 \mathrm{k} \Omega$ ). Connect a cable from the SYNC connector of the signal generator to the TRIG input of an oscilloscope. Set the oscilloscope to trigger externally. Connect the main output of the signal generator to the input of the amplifier.
3) Connect one oscilloscope probe (channel $A$ ) to the output of the signal generator. Set the Channel A vertical scale to $1 \mathrm{~V} / \mathrm{div}$.
4) Connect one oscilloscope probe (channel B) to the $200 \Omega$ load. On the oscilloscope, set the channel A vertical scale to $50 \mathrm{~V} / \mathrm{div}$, and the horizontal scale to 20 us/div.
5) Set the gain control to minimum (0.0). Turn on the amplifier and the signal generator.
6) Channel A should show a $\pm 2 \mathrm{~V}, 25 \mathrm{kHz}$ waveform from the signal generator. The Channel B waveform should have an amplitude of $\pm 60 \mathrm{~V}$, and have a shape similar to that of the Channel A waveform.
7) This completes the operational check.

## MECHANICAL INFORMATION

## TOP COVER REMOVAL

If necessary, the interior of the instrument may be accessed by removing the four Phillips screws on the top panel. With the four screws removed, the top cover may be slid back (and off).

Always disconnect the power cord and allow the instrument to sit unpowered for 10 minutes before opening the instrument. This will allow any internal stored charge to discharge.

There are no user-adjustable internal circuits. For repairs other than fuse replacement, please contact Avtech (info@avtechpulse.com) to arrange for the instrument to be returned to the factory for repair. Service is to be performed solely by qualified service personnel.

Caution: High voltages are present inside the instrument during normal operation. Do not operate the instrument with the cover removed.

## RACK MOUNTING

A rack mounting kit is available. The -R5 rack mount kit may be installed after first removing the one Phillips screw on the side panel adjacent to the front handle.

## ELECTROMAGNETIC INTERFERENCE

To prevent electromagnetic interference with other equipment, all used outputs should be connected to shielded loads using shielded coaxial cables. Unused outputs should be terminated with shielded coaxial terminators or with shielded coaxial dust caps, to prevent unintentional electromagnetic radiation. All cords and cables should be less than $3 m$ in length.

## MAINTENANCE

## REGULAR MAINTENANCE

This instrument does not require any regular maintenance.
On occasion, one or more of the four rear-panel fuses may require replacement. All fuses can be accessed from the rear panel. See the "FUSES" section for details.

## CLEANING

If desired, the interior of the instrument may be cleaned using compressed air to dislodge any accumulated dust. (See the "TOP COVER REMOVAL" section for instructions on accessing the interior.) No other cleaning is recommended.
